
Art-Related Feminist Practices Artists at Work, from Talk to Action. How to Deviate from Normativities?

a workshop of 45 minutes by with of from Maëlle Cornut & Marie-Antoinette Chiarenza & Art.School.Differences

(...) brain talk

... sometimes, when I hear a conference and it is mostly interesting, my brain starts to drift off in another room ... dreaming or reviewing the list of things done, not done ... and I'm more or less pissed off because I have not really listened to this fascinating lecture ...





(...) studio talk

... can we re-stage a work situation, a fictional art studio?

Inspired by the studios of existing artists, the set features materials of significance like books, posters, drawings, and other visuals. If requested by the participants, some of the elements can be put into practice, such as drawing or filming. A fifteen-minute document will be played twice; the first time, it will be played as an audio file and the second time as a video file to enable a multi-layered understanding of a specific topic. Using this approach, Cornut and Chiarenza hope to share their research practices and collectively address questions: what are the references that we are using? How do artists research a specific issue? And what do we bring from the brain to the hands and vice versa?

(...) who is we?

what are the references that we are using?

- ... we : here is placed ± in art_school institution how do artists research a specific issue?
- ... artists: here is placed t as students and teachers what do we bring from the brain to the hands?
- ... brain_hand : respiration between theory and praxis

(...) WORLDWIDE

women account for 66% of the world's work, produce 50% of the food, but only receive 10% of the income and own 1% of the property.

(...) 45 minutes // script workshop

... technics SET UP: adjustment video-projection and sound ... create an ambiance for discussion ... hang the GUERRILLA GIRLS posters, write the title of the workshop on the blackboard, display stats, blackboard drawing, questions on the flip chart ... should we record the sounds?

(...) 5 minutes // intro

... introducing the sub-title: artists at work, from talk to action. how to deviate from normativities? ... stating the process of co_operations between two artists ... mentioning who are those two artists ... links to their websites:

... mapping the possibilities during the workshop: listening to a video and drawing ... contextualizing the idea: the intention is to be inspired by the practice of feminist workshops (...) creating situations enabling the mix of knowledge production and actions, production of pleasure, doing nothing or talking _ collectively ... emphasizing that the main issues are related to gender (...) pointing out the tables with statistics related to gender equality (...) pointing out the posters of the GUERRILLA GIRLS the famous collective founded in 1985 in New York (...) presenting the possibilities of drawing the coloring sheets while listening at the sound file ...

drawing while listening allows to travel from the brain to the hands and vice versa

(...) ± 5 minutes // SOUND - DRAWING

(...) 15 minutes // VIDEO - DRAWING

 \dots excerpt from — EXAMINED LIFE — a canadian documentary film about philosophers directed by Astra Taylor, with Sunaura Taylor and Judith Butler.

Sunaura Taylor is painter and activist for disability and animal rights and disability activist.

Judith Butler is philosopher and gender theorist. the film shows the two protagonists discussing the means of — going for a walk — as well as the intersections between disability and gender.

when do basic needs become social issue and not only a personal issue?

embodiment = what changes with your own unique body, what your body can or can't do, physically

disability = disabling effect of society = what you can t do because of other being uncomfortable or violent

eventually more specific QUESTIONS about art practice could be raised

how do artists research a specific issue? how to avoid reproducing the same?

who chooses the references?

which exhibition or event touched you recently?

political aspect in visual production
