### Bodies Remediated: Another Next First Conversation

## Workshop Program

#### **Short Abstract**

Designed as an international two-day workshop, *Bodies Remediated* engages interdisciplinary exchange on skilled practices and their digital remediation, in and across current domains of art, science, and technology.

## **Longer Abstract**

How do skilled practices in current domains of art, science, and technology engage with new forms of digital remediation? What contemporary "dialectic[s] of de- and re-skilling" (Bishop 2017) are at play?

Over recent decades, social studies of art, science, and technology have focused on situated practices, embodied skills, and multiple experiments. In the vein of this "practice turn," the bodies of competent practitioners have commanded analytic attention in many domains, be it in expert, instructional, and/or aesthetic contexts. So have interdisciplinary reconfigurations, if not 'post-normal' achievements.

In turn, the latest delivery of information technology (e.g., "generative AI") raises the question of embodied practices, their digital remediation, and its ambivalent consequences with renewed acuteness, sometimes challenging the very purpose of practice and pedagogy. Yet what exactly are the stakes and issues involved for current domains of artistic, scientific, and/or technological practice, stakes and issues that sit at the interdisciplinary nexus of media, skilled practice, and cultural studies.

This workshop sets out with tackling the raised question. Therefore, it brings together qualitative researchers in the social sciences, arts practitioners, and education scholars approaching and reflecting upon *Bodies Remediated* in and beyond their current work.
